We are a "Welcome, completely" kind of church.


Here's the thing We have a lot of friends who have given up on church.

We all have to pick our battles. And decide what really matters.

There are seven things that we've decided matter most for us. We have fought hard for these seven things. Those battles have defined us. They continue to shape us.

For us, these are hills worth dying on!

We think our focus on these seven hills help us create a space that feels like home for those who have given up on church. (And those who haven't.)

1. WE'LL DIE ON THE HILL OF LOVING.

People have a lot of ideas about what God is like. Some of those ideas are weird. Some are downright terrifying.

We think it's pretty simple, actually. God is love. Of all the words they could have used to describe God, the writers of the Bible picked that one to sum it all up. God is love!

We'll die on the hill of **loving**, like Jesus did.

Loving every single person. Loving unconditionally. Loving all the time. Loving no matter what.

WE'LL DIE ON THE HILL OF ACCEPTING.

Maybe you've been there. You've been told you don't really belong. Or maybe they didn't use words. You just felt it. You weren't really accepted.

And every single person has a part to play. It takes all of us for this place to be all it can be. We need each other to do all the things God is calling us to do.



6. WE'LL DIE ON THE HILL OF IMPACTING.

We **support** local organizations who are making a difference. We **offer** space in our facility to community groups to expand their programing.

We **partner** with a few organizations and bring our time and energy to what they are already doing to try to make an impact in the world around us.

We **work** to make things in the world look a little more like the Kingdom of God.

Lisanjala Church is our sister church in Malawi, Africa. We have a beautiful partnership that's built on the theme of mutual encouragement. We work hard to have an impact there. And they work really hard to have an impact on us. It works!

Our friends in Malawi have hosted nearly 100 of us in their homes over the last 10 years. They've fed us and taught us. They've shown us Jesus. They even raised funds to help us build our church building.

Through that partnership, we provide clean drinking water, support education by feeding preschool children through a porridge program, and fund scholarships for high school and college students.

7. WE'LL DIE ON THE HILL OF AUTHENTIC-ING.

Yeah, we know it's not a word. We're just real like that.

But seriously, what you see is what you get.

If you are looking for a church of people who have it all together, you might need to look elsewhere.

If you need a pastor who has all the answers, this may not be the place for you.

If you are perfect, please don't come mess up the good thing we've got going here.

This is a place where you can bring your baggage, your vices, your struggles, your doubts, your fears, and your flaws. We bring ours.

When we are free to be real, we are more likely to encounter the real Jesus.

And when we encounter Jesus, we find healing, hope, meaning, and the freedom to live like Jesus did.
